

Wins Title



Here is the new Atlanta open golf champion. He is George Sargent, pro at East Lake, who turned in a 146 to win the title at Druid Hills yesterday. Errie Ball was second. Julius Hughes won the amateur title.

SOUTHEASTERN ATHLETES BEST

Southeastern conference track and field athletes have outshone Southern conference stars on a basis of dual meet performances this year in 10 of 14 events listed on the usual contest programs.

Only two interconference meets have been held, in which both Georgia and Georgia Tech defeated Clemson, but a check-up of the times and distances made by athletes of both conferences in all dual engagements shows the Southeastern ahead. In some instances the average of the Southern aces have been better than the Southeastern, although the latter's representatives have reported the best single act.

The Southern has a clear superiority in the javelin throw and the two-mile run. LeGore, of North Carolina, has thrown the spear 10 feet further than Batchelor, of Georgia. LeGore's best was slightly above 200 feet. The 9 minutes 45.5 seconds two-mile race by Lauck, of Virginia, is far better than the Southeastern's fastest race. Several other Southern conference runners have stepped the distance in under 10 minutes—the quickest any Southeastern racer has traveled. Although Mahan, of Kentucky, has run the mile in 4 minutes 24.2 seconds—a fraction of a second faster than Lauck, the Virginian has the best season's average time.

JULIUS HUGHES WINS AMATEUR CHAMPIONSHIP

East Lake Pro Scores 146; Hughes Has Card of 148.

George Sargent, veteran professional at East Lake Country Club, Wednesday afternoon won the second annual Atlanta open championship over the rain-soaked Druid Hills course, with two consistent rounds of 73 each for a 146. Julius Hughes, a Druid Hills star, won the amateur with a 148 for the 98 holes.

Sargent, who won the national open title in 1909, came into his own again with two fine rounds, particularly during the afternoon, to lead one of the strongest fields of golfers ever entered for a city event.

Hughes is also a former champion, having won the city amateur title several years ago on the East Lake course.

Errie Ball, defending champion, assistant to Sargent at East Lake, had the best nine-hole score, 33, during the first nine of the afternoon, when he picked up five strokes on the leaders, but "blew up" a few minutes later in the rainstorm. He finished second to Sargent.

H. O. Davis and Julius Hughes shared the lead at the end of the morning round with 71s, one over par, with Sargent second, two strokes back, and L. R. Hunter and Dan Sage, young Ansley Park golfer, tied for fourth place.

Starting the afternoon round with a dozen players having almost an equal chance to win, Sargent continued a steady pace and went out in 36, equaling par. The heavy rain caught Sargent, Howard Beckett and Garrison Ballenger at the tenth green, where Sargent required a five, one over par. He dropped two more strokes to par on the 11th and another at the 12th. He picked up two with birdies on the 14th and 15th and gave the crowd a fine exhibition on the long 18th when he finished with a birdie four. His second, just short of the green, was one of his best shots of the day.

MANY GIVE UP.

The heavy rain sent the scores skyward during the afternoon and several of the players picked up after a couple of bad holes. Many amateurs were thrown off their game by the heavy greens and soggy fairways, but the veterans kept plugging along.

In the second amateur division J. R. (Kid) Brown, young Tech Hill star, set the pace with a 155. After a bad round of 81 during the morning Brown carded a fine 74 during the afternoon.

Second place in the amateur division was divided between C. M. Bowden and Jimmy Wilson, with 160's for the 36 holes.
