For Jackson, the one-time Meadowbrooks club champion, it T was his first Atlanta win. He l equaled par on his morning excursion. In the afternoon despite three bogies he shaved two strokes off par and finished 69.

Jackson's victory in the 1949 s Meadowbrooks club championship play was his last amateur outing. He has played professionally ever since. Last pro try for the 1953 Atlanta Open champion was in I March, when he finished way h down the line in the Gulfport, Miss., Open.

Richard Beckmann, Marietta Country Club pro, was the last player to post his score Friday. He balanced a morning 76 with 65 and took down third professional money.

Jimmy Stamps coupled a pair of 72s for 144 to tie Beckmann and win third amateur prize.

Host pro and one of the tourney favorites, Dempsey Wright, soared to a 77 on his first try. He finished the day with 71 and 148 total.
