# Donald Wins Jr. Golf

ATLANTA — Robert Donald of Athens fired a three-under par 69 Wednesday to win the Eighth Annual Georgia Junior PGA Golf Championship at Dunwoody Country Club.

Donald, who will attend the University of Georgia on a golf scholarship, finished with a 140, five-shots ahead of his nearest challengers.

Maconite Al Fortney, Idle Hour, and Atlanta's Ricky Hall, the first day leader, tied for second with 145s. Fortney went 72-73, while Hall was 70-75 over the par-72 layout.
