## Waddell Winner Of State Junior

Waddell put himself into the position of needing a birdie on the final hole with four bogeys on the front side. He had started play on the back nine Wednesday and had three birdies at the turn.

Drury was two-under-par for the day's play with four holes to go but bogeyed 15, 16 and 17


Waddell had the added pressure of University of Georgia golf coach Dick Copas standing off to the side of the final hole watching. The youngster makes no bones about his ambitions of following in the footsteps of his father, Elliott Waddell, who was captain of the Bulldog golf team in 1939.
