McDonald beats Love for PGA Juniors title

Dalton's Bill McDonald, playing in the 14-15 age division, shot a blistering final-round 68 Wednesday and then defeated Davis Love III of Sea Island on the first sudden-death hole to win the Georgia Section PGA Junior golf title at Riverside.

Easily winning his age division, a pair of eagles gave McDonald a 143 to put him in the clubhouse with the overall lead. However, four hours later, Love sank a birdie putt on the final hole to force the playoff.

And it appeared that Love, who won the 16-17 division, would take the overall title on the playoff hole when McDonald's 6-iron shot rolled off the green on the par-4 No. 1. But Love flew the green with a 9-iron, and his ball hit the cart path, landing close to the ladies tee on No. 2.

The first day co-leader made a brilliant recovery shot but settled for a bogey. McDonald chipped within 2 feet of the pin on his third shot and won the tournament with a tap-in par.

I thought I had lost it when I missed the green," McDonald said. "I should have hit a 7-iron. The wind was blowing before I hit, so I went to a 6-iron. By the time I hit the ball, the wind stopped."

LOVE, WHO had to shoot 2-under on the final nine holes to make it to the playoff, wasn't second guessing his club selection. "I was 140 yards away, and I hit a 9-iron. The ball just flew on me, and when it hit the cart path, it took off."

McDonald carded eagles on No. 12 and 18 and added a birdie on No. 2 to turn in the best round of the tournament.

He chipped in with a sand wedge from 30 yards on No. 12. On 18, he hit a 3-iron 4 feet from the pin and made the putt. The lone birdie came when he hit a 1-iron 5 feet from the pin on the par-3 second hole.

In division play, McDonald was followed by Mark Love of Sea Island (151) and Scott Nystrom of Macon (153) in the 14-15 division. In 16-17, Davis Love beat Griffin's Steve Pitts (146) by three shots.
