# Brother-sister standouts win shot at national title

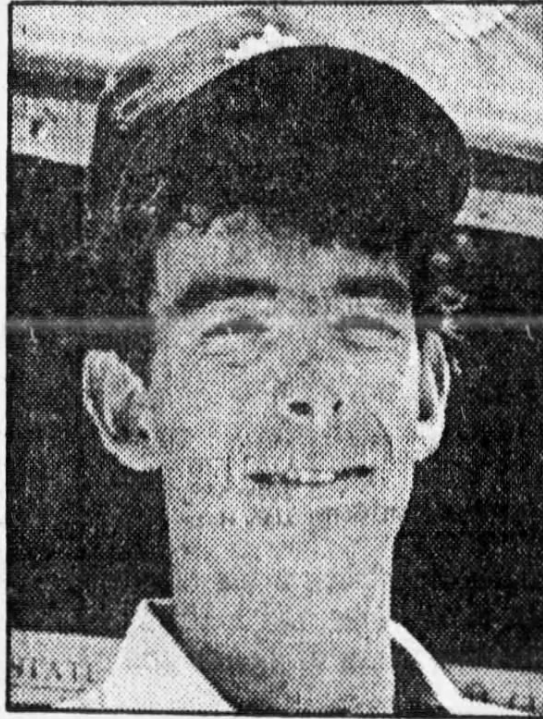
**ATHENS** — Vicky and Nicky Goetze of Hull, Ga., became the first brother and sister to qualify for the PGA National Junior Championship in the same year by winning the Georgia PGA Junior tournament Wednesday.



Vicky, 14, won the girls' division for the third consecutive year with a 36-hole score of 150 at the University of Georgia course, beating second-place finisher Tonya Gill by 21 strokes. Nicky, 16, won the 16-17-year-old boys' division with a 147 that included birdies on two of the final four holes for a two-shot margin over Neal Hendee of Duluth.

The Goetzes were the first brother and sister to play in the same national tournament last year, but Nicky entered through an exemption. This year's tournament will be played Aug. 25-28 on the PGA National course at Palm Beach Gardens, Fla.

Brad Wages won the 13-15 boys' division with a 155; Anthony Cox of Columbus won the 12-and-under title with an 18-hole total of 73.
