Mason Wins Second E-Z-GO/PING Georgia PGA Championship

James Mason of Jimmy Mozley's Golf Center fired a tournament-low 6-under 66 in his final round to finish at 12-under par 204 and secure his second E-Z-GO/Ping Georgia PGA Championship at The Hampton Club on St. Simons Island. Upon his return to Coastal Georgia following a two-week postponement because of Hurricane Floyd, Mason posted rounds of 67-66 to win by four strokes and claim the \$8,000 first prize.

With the win, Mason earned examptions into the PGA Tour's Buick Challenge and the Southern Region CPC at PGA Golf Club in Port St. Lucie, Fla. Craig Stevens of Brookstone Country Club finished in second place at 8-under 208, taking home \$5,000, while Chan Reeves of Atlanta Athletic Club claimed third place and \$3,250.

The PGA Golf Professional of the Year Award is determined annually be the PGA

of America to honor the working club professional whose total contributions to the game best exemplify the complete PGA Professional. While the honor is based on the candidate's entire record, special emphasis is placed on performance and achievement over the past five years in criteria such as performance at the individual's club, service to the PGA Section and the Association, leadership ability, and promotion of golf.

For Hoard, who was named the 1996 National Horton Smith Award winner for his contributions to educating the PGA Professional, 1999 has been quite a memorable year. In addition to being the recipient of the PGA of America's highest honor, Hoard was inducted into the Georgia Golf Hall of Fame earlier this year.
